Chairman's Report

The major focus of the Trust continues to be the educational endeavours of our shareholders' whanau, accounting for 74% of the support provided.

It is very pleasing to note that the achievement grades of our applicants are concentrated in the upper quartile with many working towards professional careers. This bodes well for future leadership roles in all aspects of community and business life.

The number of applications other than for education continue to be low but this is not unexpected given the relatively modest sums available for such grants.

The Trust also paid out \$28,751 in Education and Year 13 Grants (90 and 11 respectively). It is again disappointing that there were 32 two applications (23% of those received) that could not be considered because they were incomplete.
